1.	RECOM	MENDATION		
1.1	It is recommended that the contract for the Provision of a Women's Pathfinder Pan Wales Triage (Diversion Scheme) be awarded to Tenderer's B, E and F, in accordance with paragraph 81 of the Manual of Governance.			
1.2	The contract is awarded for six (6) months with an option to extend for a further twelve (12) months subject to funding.			
2.	INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND			
2.1	In 2014 the Commissioner successfully submitted a bid to the Home Office Innovation Grant Fund for funding to support a pilot on behalf of the four Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) in Wales and National Offender Management Service (NOMS) in Wales. The Services required are to undertake a project to pilot the Diversion Scheme. The Project will include the Diversion Scheme at one triage pilot site in each of the Police Force areas at the following four Premises across Wales			
		Newport (Gwent)		
		Merthyr Tydfil (South Wales)		
		St Asaph (North Wales)		
		Haverfordwest (Dyfed-Powys)		
2.2	The Women's Pathfinder provides a whole system approach including support for women as an alternative to charging, during bail and pre-sentence and during resettlement from custody. Additional to this, women can self-refer to the Pathfinder if they have previously been involved with the Criminal Justice Service (CJS) or identify themselves as being at risk of committing offences. The majority of CJS involvement with female service users is related to violent and/or acquisitive offending behaviour, whilst prevailing presenting problems are deficits in thinking and behaviour, lifestyle and associates, substance misuse, accommodation, mental health issues and victimisation issues, these latter two most often not being directly related to offences but significant as responsivity issues when engaging females with services.			

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2.3	Research was undertaken to establish if there were any suitable frameworks or contract available to utilise prior to carrying out a full tender process. There are no available frameworks/contracts for this requirement.					
2.4	The tender process undertaken was the open procedure and suppliers were required to submit their Invitation to Tender (ITT) document by 14 July 2015.					
3.	ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION					
3.1	Eight suppliers responded to the ITT by the closing date. Five of the tenderers submitted a bid for one location only, two tenderers submitted a bid for all four locations and one tenderer submitted a bid for two locations. The responses were evaluated on the basis of the Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT).					
3.1	The responses were evaluated by the evaluation panel consisting of the; Dip Regional Manager, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner Gwent; Director of Commissioning, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner Dyfed Powys, Project Lead for Reducing Offending and Re-offending, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner South Wales; Commissioning Officer, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner North Wales, IOM Cymru Women's Pathfinder Project Manager. The process was facilitated by the Head of Procurement on behalf of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent.					
3.2	The evaluation criterion used were; 40% commercial and 60% technical (specification).					
3.4	Below is a breakdown of the scores achieved by the suppliers and agreed by the evaluation panel:
