Subject	Police Commissioner's Partnership Fund
Summary	The purpose of this paper is to record the decision to provide funding, available via the Police Commissioner's Fund, to assist organisations involved in activities that reduce crime and anti-social behaviour or divert people away from related activity.


DECISION

1. In order to assist in the delivery of the Police and Crime Plan priorities, I have established a recurrent commissioning fund of up to £100,000. This will be known as the Police Commissioner's Partnership Fund.
2. I have decided to use the fund to provide grants to assist organisations involved in activities that seek to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour or divert people away from related activity. Groups applying for the grant will have to show how the use of the grant will meet this criterion.
3. Applications will be sought in two tiers. Tier one will provide funding for projects up to £10,000 and Tier two will provide funding from £10,001 to a maximum grant of £25,000 per organisation applying.
4. Each successful grant recipient organisation will need to provide me with such information to reassure me that the funding granted is being used effectively to provide a service that meets my priorities for Gwent as stipulated in my Police and Crime Plan.
5. Further application information is available via the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.
