

Keeping Safe



- ◆ Everyone has the right to feel safe
- ◆ If someone treats you badly because of who you are it is called Hate Crime

Examples of Hate Crime



Sending you nasty messages



Calling you nasty names



Hurting you, bullying you, punching or kicking you



Damaging your things

How to report a Hate Crime



- ◆ If you are a victim of a hate crime you must contact the police



- ◆ Call 999 in an emergency
For example - if someone hit you, damaged your home or made you feel that your life was in danger



- ◆ Call 101 if it's not an emergency
For example - if someone sent you a nasty message or called you names



- ◆ Or message Gwent Police on Facebook messenger or Twitter



- ◆ Or email contact@gwent.police.uk

What happens when you report a Hate Crime?



- ◆ You must tell the person on the phone or in the message what has happened



- ◆ You will be given an incident number - make sure to keep this safe



- ◆ A police officer will then contact you by phone or they will come to see you at home



- ◆ Someone from Gwent Police Victim Care Unit will call you and support you
