PURPOSE: Decision

1. RECOMMENDATION

That the Commissioner agrees to the continuation of the Animal Welfare Scheme and that the Scheme should be chaired by a member of the scheme.

2. INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND

The Animal Welfare Scheme is the system whereby volunteers attend police stations/other locations as agreed to check on the welfare of police dogs and the environment in which they are kept. It offers protection to both police dogs and the police and provides reassurance to the community at large. The responsibility for organising and overseeing the delivery of Animal Welfare Scheme lies with the Commissioner in consultation with the Chief Constable. Dog section staff work closely with the OPCC. Dog section staff and OPCC staff contribute to training sessions and meetings. We are also well supported by the RSPCA.

There are current 13 visitors in Gwent. They visit in pairs on a monthly basis. We provide a rota and the visitors themselves decide what day and time to visit. They choose which station to attend and Sergeant Maria Henry of the dog section arranges for handlers to attend with their dogs at the appropriate time. The volunteers are vetted to a basic level.

We previously had dog kennels in Gwent based at ROF Glascoed in Usk, however due to changes in the infrastructure made by BAE who own the site, Gwent dogs are now kennelled in Waterton, Bridgend. Gwent dogs are only taken there if their handlers are on holiday or on a course. All handlers keep their dogs at home with them the rest of the time. A Memorandum of Understanding with South Wales Police is in place for this arrangement. Whilst in Waterton, Gwent dogs are visited by South Wales Animal Welfare Visitors who report to us if there are any areas for concern.

The Scheme is satisfied that the dogs are well cared for however, visitors remain vigilant. There are no current issues of concern. The visitors meet as a group 3 or 4 times per year.

As a matter of interest, Summerhill Vets provide a service to owners of retired police dogs in exchange for the display of the logo on police dog vans. As it is not possible to obtain medical insurance for retired police dogs, Summerhill have offered to provide free vaccinations, cost price medication and free euthanasia, when appropriate.

3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION

The Commissioner will need to consider who will chair the scheme. Previously this role was carried out by a Police Authority member. The options would be
