**PURPOSE:** 

The purpose of this report is to seek approval from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) to award a Contract

for the Provision of High Performance Vehicles.

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1.	RECOMMENDATION			
1.1	The Contract is awarded to Tenderer A for a period of 2 years with an option to extend for a further 1 year under the National Police Improvement Agency (NPIA) Framework for the Provision of High Performance Vehicles. The Contract is awarded under the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent Governance Part 5 Standing Orders Relating to Contracts, paragraph 88, most economically advantageous tender (MEAT).			
2.	INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND			
2.1	Currently both Gwent and Dyfed Powys Police utilise the NPIA Framework for the Provision of High Performance Vehicles. The Framework requires contracting Authority's to carry out mini competitions under the guidance of the Framework. Therefore it was decided that Gwent would lead on a new Procurement process to include Gwent and Dyfed Powys Police to potentially reduce the cost of the provision throughout the two Forces.			
3.	ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION			
3.1	A mini competition has been undertaken in accordance with the instructions laid down in the tender documentation provided by the NPIA Framework. Three suppliers who were named in the agreement were invited to tender and provided tender submissions.			
3.2	The following evaluation criteria was specified by the NPIA Framework; Rates and Charges 70% (made up of Whole life costs 50%, Warranty 5%, Training 5%, Spare Parts 10%) and Specification of Requirements 30% (made up of 20% Specification of vehicles, 5% training and 5% delivery/lead times).			
3.3	The panel consisted of Head of Fleet from Gwent Police, Head of Fleet and Contracts Officer from Dyfed Powys Police. Responses to the specification were scored by the evaluation panel.			
3.4	Below is a full breakdown of scores achieved by each supplier under each evaluation criteria. Tenderer C did not achieve a score as they were unable to provide us with vehicles to evaluate that met our criteria, therefore they were non compliant in their bid process.			

3.5	This Calculation reflects the scores for the Automatic Version of the vehicles.
