Summary	To record the decision of the Police and Crime Commissioner regarding the continuation of shared police dog kennelling facilities between Gwent and South Wales Police.	

DECISION

- 1. Since 2011/12, the Gwent Police dog kennelling provision has been delivered in a collaborative arrangement with South Wales Police.
- 2. It is considered that the provision of such a joint facility provides a more efficient and effective service across the two forces. The benefits of such an approach include greater resilience and flexibility of staff and resources, a reduction in the duplication of roles and/or premises, enhanced capability and capacity and financial savings.
- 3. The service provision detailed in the Section 22a Agreement has been drafted by the Joint Legal Services department in line with the arrangements in place for 2016/17 and will commence from 1st April 2016.
- 4. The provision of services will be monitored via the Section 22a Performance Monitoring Group.
