1.	RECOMMENDATION				
1.1	It is recommended that the Contract for the Provision of an Alcohol Diversion Scheme (the Scheme) be awarded to Supplier A, in accordance with Paragraph 84, Most Economically Advantageous Tender (MEAT) of the Manual of Corporate Governance.				
1.2	The Contract is to be awarded for a period of two (2) years with an option to extend for two (2) additional annual periods.				
2.	INTRODU	INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND			
2.1	It was identified by an Inspector for West Policing Team, Sergeant in the West Neighbourhood Policing Team and Head of Criminal Justice Department at Gwent Police that there was a requirement for an Alcohol Diversion Scheme to be established. The Scheme would allow for an alternative rehabilitation solution for adult offenders, who have been arrested for alcohol related offences.				
2.2	The aim of the Scheme is to achieve a reduction in the level of alcohol-fuelled crime and the possibility of reoffending, to minimise the risk to the individuals and the wider community.				
2.3	The introduction and development of these types of schemes are linked to the Government's Alcohol Strategy and the Crown Prosecution Services implementation of Conditional Caution as a Disposal.				
2.4	Service Users that will be eligible for the Scheme will have been arrested and detained in Custody for one or more of the following offences:

2.5	 Eligibility criteria for referring an offender; Aged 18 or over Has made an admission of guilt to the offence Accepts to attend the diversion course Has no previous convictions or cautions within the last two years It is apparent that the Scheme is likely to benefit the offender and contribute towards reduced reoffending 		
2.6	The Scheme shall be in the form of an interactive educational course, provided and delivered by a Supplier, at an off-site location within the Force area.		
2.7	Consultation was undertaken with the three other Welsh forces to establish their interest in the Scheme. Expressions of interest were received from the three Welsh forces.		
2.8	A specification was drafted and approved by the stakeholders from the four forces, their requirements were incorporated into the Invitation to Tender (ITT) document.		
3.	ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION		
3.1	The tender opportunity was published on 13 September 2017 through the Sell2Wales Portal, where eight suppliers accessed the ITT document. The deadline for tender submissions was 13 October 2017; two responses were received by the closing date.		
3.2	As part of the ITT document and tender process, there was a pre-qualification questionnaire for suppliers to complete. The questionnaire was made up of a number of pass fail and information only questions. To be able to progress to the next stage suppliers had to obtain a pass mark to all pass-fail questions.		
	The responses were evaluated on the following evaluation criteria; Quality (60%) and Cost (40%). The quality criteria was made up of ten tender response questions.		

3.3	Below is a full breakdown of the scores achieved by the two supplier's tender

- 3.4 The evaluation process was carried out by Chief Inspector (Gwent Police), Portfolio Lead Offender Management & Substance Misuse (South Wales Police) and Procurement Officer (North Wales Police). The evaluation process was facilitated by a Senior Procurement Officer (Gwent Police).
- On completion of the evaluation process, the evaluation panel agreed the scores attributed to each supplier during the evaluation process and the identification of the successful supplier, through the most economically advantageous tender.

4. NEXT STEPS

4.1 On approval of the report, all suppliers will be issued with ten day standstill letters notifying of our intention to award the Contract in accordance with the award criteria.

5. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- 5.1 There are no financial considerations for the force, the cost of course attendance is paid by the service user directly to the supplier.
- 5.3 The value of this contract for all forces is approximately £250,089 per annum based on the successful supplier's costs submitted. A breakdown for each force is provided below;

Gwent Police - £22.508

South Wales Police - £130.046

North Wales Police – £70,024

Dyfed Powys Police - £27.509
