## **DECISION**


1. Previous publication of Decision Log number PCCG-2018-019 confirmed the intention to establish a Positive Impact Fund in each of the Local Policing Areas (LPAs). Funding of £10,000 was awarded to each LPA on the understanding that awards could be granted for projects that are able to demonstrate a positive impact on the communities they serve, whilst at the same time contributing to delivering the Police and Crime Plan priorities.
2. Funding was provided to a number of projects during 2020/21, a list of which can be found at Appendix 1. These grants have been distributed throughout the year.
3. It is my intention to run the process again throughout 2021/22.
