Subject	Police Property Act Fund	
Summary	The purpose of this paper is to record the decision to continue to use the Police Property Fund to help reduce crime and anti-social behaviour or divert people away from crime and to increase the maximum award available under the Police Property Act from £500 to £5,000	

DECISION

- 1. Property which comes into the possession of the police in connection with a crime and where the owner cannot be found can be sold. The money is kept in a Police Property Act Fund. The proceeds may then be used to make payments for charitable purposes.
- I have decided to continue to use the fund to provide grants to help reduce crime and anti-social behaviour or divert people away from crime. Groups applying for the grant will have to show how the use of the grant will meet this criterion.
- 3. Currently the maximum grant allowed via the Gwent fund is £500 but I recognise that some worthwhile projects will require more financial support if they are to be successful. I have decided therefore to increase the maximum grant available from the fund to £5,000 per application.
- 4. Each successful grant recipient organisation will need to provide me with such information to reassure me that the funding granted is being used effectively to provide a service that meets my priorities for Gwent as stipulated in my Police and Crime Plan.
- 5. Further application information is available via the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner.
