2.1	It was agr	reed at the Estates Strategy Board on 27 th November 2020, that Gwent		
	Police wo	ould build a new Abergavenny Hub.		
2.2	An estimated budget for the project has been agreed and a plot of land has been identified for the location of the new Hub.			
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	out any further competition. In order to ensure that value for money is achieved
	for the project, the works packages that are to be subcontracted shall be subject
	to a competitive tendering process led by the main contractor. The Project
	Management team shall be involved in the development and evaluation of these
	subcontractor tenders.
2.6	The framework has been reviewed by the Force's Procurement Department, to
	ensure this is a compliant route to market.
3.	ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION
3.1	There is a 0.5% fee associated with using this framework, which will be built into
	the final agreed contract price.
3.2	The project team has been established with internal and external
	representatives.
4.	NEXT STEPS
4.1	Upon approval to proceed has been agreed, the project team will engage with
	the Contractor to produce a (free) feasibility report which would detail the
	proposed costs for review.
4.2	Upon the approval of this feasibility report, a further report will then be submitted
	for approval to the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC).
5.	FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS
5.1	It is not possible to confirm the exact contract value at this time, as the contractor
	will need to complete the feasibility study which will then need to be agreed by
	the project team. However, the estimated budget for this project of £3.5m has
	been incorporated within the Capital Programme element of the Medium-Term
	Financial Projections
6.	PERSONNEL CONSIDERATIONS

7.1	A Legal review of the call off contract will be completed by an external provider.
7.2	The call off contract is in the form of an NEC4 contract.

	presence is provided however, through a Station Enquiry Officer who is co-
	located with partners within the town centre. Gwent Police's mission is to protect
	and reassure communities and not having a permanent operational policing
	base in Abergavenny, will have a negative impact on the community and fail
	deliver effective policing services. A new operational policing base in
	Abergavenny (to complement the town centre provision), is needed as soon as
	possible and awarding the contract using the direct award framework is the most
	efficient, effective and compliant way to engage with the contractor and
	complete the project.
