Summary	To record the allocation of funding for the two force Local Policing Areas out of the Positive Impact Fund that the Police and Crime Commissioner established in 2019/20.


**DECISION**

1. Previous publication of Decision Log number PCCG-2018-019 confirmed the intention to establish a Positive Impact Fund in each of the Local Policing Areas (LPA's). Funding of £10,000 was awarded to each LPA on the understanding that awards could be granted for projects that are able to demonstrate a positive impact on the communities they serve, whilst at the same time contributing to delivering the Police and Crime Plan priorities.
2. Funding was provided to a number of projects during 2019/20, a list of which can be found at Appendix 1. These grants have been distributed throughout the year.
