**PURPOSE:**

## 1. RECOMMENDATION 1.1 To inform the Commissioner of the sale of the car park adjacent to Abercarn Police Station to Caerphilly County Borough Council (CCBC) for the sum of £7,500. 2. INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND 2.1 Abercarn Police Station is currently for sale through our Estate Agents, Bruton Knowles Ltd Cardiff. The premises are offered for sale at £40,000 and cost of premises and a car park. The Police Authority authorised the disposal of the property on 27 January 2011 as part of tranche 1 of the Estates Strategy. The car park is approximately 25 metres away from the Police Station and the car park and Police Station are separated by another private building as shown on the attached plan at Annex 1. There has been very little interest in the premises and no offers have been received at this time. Caerphilly CBC has asked to purchase the car park to alleviate congestion at Ysgol Gymraeg Cwm Cwyddon, the local primary school. The offer price is £7,500. The Manual of Corporate Governance agrees a delegation of property transactions up to the value of £80,000 to the Chief Financial officer of the Chief Constable (paragraph 6.25). 3. ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION The value of the whole site has been considered along with any issues that 3.1 might arise if the station and car park are sold as separate lots. The Police Station will be disposed through an Auction and it is expected that the sale price will be now be less than the original £40,000 marketing figure as the car park will be sold as a separate item. The sale of the car park will greatly assist Caerphilly CBC and benefit the school and the local community. The car park has been subject to some "fly tipping" and is in a poor state of repair and will require new tarmacadam surfacing and new gates.

4.	NEXT STEPS	
4.1	On approval to the proposed sale, the Solicitors will be appointed to undertake the conveyance work to sell the property to Caerphilly CBC.	
5.	FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS	
5.1	There will be a capital receipt of £7,500 for the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC). There will be agency and legal costs of approximately £1,500, generating net proceeds of £6,000. Advice on the sale has been received from a qualified valuer which confirms that the sale maximises value for money for the Police and Crime Commissioner.
