

Subject	Grant Funding Allocation 2016/ 17
Summary	The purpose of this paper is to record the decision to provide allocated grant funding to partnership organisations for the financial year 2016/17 only.

DECISION

1. The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 provides under sections 9 and 10 that the Police and Crime Commissioner for a police area makes crime and disorder grants and acts in co-operation with responsible authorities and makes arrangements with criminal justice agencies for the exercise of functions so as to provide an efficient and effective criminal justice system for the area.
2. I have considered the requirements under the Act, the current service provision landscape in Gwent and the progress made to date in producing a comprehensive grant commissioning framework. I have also facilitated inclusion into the process of Safer Gwent members to devise the application process and assess funding allocations. I have considered the Strategic Commissioning Board recommendations and decided to distribute each of the respective grants to the various organisations in accordance with the schedule attached at Annex A.
3. Each of these organisations will need to provide me with such information to reassure me that the funding allocated is being used effectively to provide a service that meets my Policing Priorities for Gwent as stipulated in my Police and Crime Plan.
