1.	<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>
1.1	It is recommended that the above mentioned contract be extended for a further forty two (42) days until 28 th March 2021. This is in accordance to Contract Standing Order paragraph 124(b),
2.	<u>INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND</u>
2.1	Gwent Police (GP) facilitated a mini competition under the National Procurement Service (NPS) framework (ref NPS-PSU-0010-14) on behalf of South Wales Police (SWP) and Dyfed Powys Police (DPP). The contract commenced on 1 December 2015 for an initial term of three (3) years until 30 November 2018, with an option to extend for twelve (12) months until 30 November 2019.
2.2	The extension option was utilised but the full 12 months was not taken. The extension was taken and made to co-terminate with the NPS framework on 15 th November 2019. The NPS decided to terminate the framework earlier than planned.
2.3	To date, SWP have not utilised this contract, they will continue to use temporary staff sourced from their in-house recruitment pool. DPP have confirmed that they wish to be included within our extension request.
2.4	This is linked to a previous extension which was approved under Decision Number: PCCG-2020-010 and PCCG-2019-059.
3.	<u>ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION</u>
3.1	The framework expired on the 15 th November 2019, therefore extending this contract will be at GP risk. There has been a delay completing the required documentation by the business area for various reasons, one of which is the result of Covid 19. A replacement tender has been issued via an NPS framework 'NPS-PS-0088 18 Provision of Temporary Workers & Supply

	Teachers, Lot 1 – Master Vendor Managed Service Provider’. The anticipated commencement of the contract is the 28 th March 2021.
3.2	The framework being used only has three (3) suppliers, GP’s current incumbent is one of them. Therefore should they win the tender the projected award and subsequent commencement date would be shorter.
	The incumbent supplier has confirmed that they are willing to accept a further 42 (day) extension to the current contract and acknowledge that should they win, this extension would terminate in order for the new contract to start.
4.	<u>NEXT STEPS</u>
4.1	On approval of the report, a contract extension will be issued to the current supplier and signed by both parties.
4.2	The contract will be updated on the ‘BlueLight’ database and Dyfed Powys Police will be informed.
5.	<u>FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS</u>
5.1	The incumbent supplier has confirmed that they will apply the current rates and margins. Pricing will only change to reflect legislative changes or annual increments from both Forces.
6.	<u>PERSONNEL CONSIDERATIONS</u>
6.1	As part of this extension there will be no internal staffing/personnel implications above and beyond the normal requirements of the current service provided to the Commissioner.
7.	<u>LEGAL IMPLICATIONS</u>
7.1	The proposed extension period is not provided for under the terms of the original Framework and subsequent GP contract and therefore any further extension is not permitted under the Public Contract Regulations (PCR). This would therefore amount to an illegal direct award (please see Risk section 9).
8.	<u>EQUALITIES AND HUMAN RIGHTS CONSIDERATIONS</u>
8.1	This report has been considered against the general duty to promote equality, as stipulated under the Strategic Equality Plan and has been assessed not to discriminate against any particular group. Consideration has been given to requirements of the Articles contained in the European Convention on Human Rights and the Human Rights Act 1998 in preparing this report.
9.	<u>RISK</u>
9.1	Should this report not be approved the risks are:

	- spend for temporary agency staff would be non-compliant and in breach of the Commissioners Manual of Corporate Governance and the Public Contracts Regulations 2015
9.2	There is a potential risk that this further extension outside of NPS framework terms may be challenged by suppliers. This is hopefully mitigated by current tendering process underway.




