

1) Schools accessed

PI 1: WELSH FORCES TO ENDEAVOUR TO ACCESS 95% OF SCHOOLS ACROSS WALES DURING THE 2013-14 ACADEMIC YEAR.

To clearly identify number of schools accessed a RAG system is used to provide an indication of the status of Programme delivery. <u>Measures</u> 95% - Green, 90-94%, - Amber Under 90% - Red

The overall percentage of schools accessed last academic year was 99.7%, the highest access rate to date. This shows an increase of 1.2% from the previous academic year (2012-13) and an 8.6% rise from 2011-12%.

Last year's figures reflect a consistent 100% access level by Gwent and North Wales over the last two years, and a 3% increase by South Wales to achieve a 100% access rate this year. Dyfed Powys achieved a 98.6% an increase of 0.6% which in real terms means only 5 schools were not accessed in the whole of Wales. The access level as a percentage by force and nationally from 2013 to 2014 can be seen in **appendix 1**.

2a) Lesson delivery and consequent changes to the matrix

By the culmination of the last academic year (2013-14) officers had succeeded in delivering 27,371 lessons and had achieved 648,825 pupil contacts reflecting a very high level of engagement with Welsh children and young people. This reflects a 5.8% increase in the national level of lesson delivery this academic year compared to the previous academic year and an increase of 10.4% in pupil contacts. Three forces have exceeded the previous year's lesson delivery totals namely South Wales, Dyfed Powys and North Wales while Gwent has dropped marginally. **Appendix 2** shows the increased lesson delivery by strand in the AWSLCP from 2011-12 to 2013-14. **Appendix 3** shows the actual lesson delivery break down for 2013-14

The precedent is to compare the core lessons against the supplementary to evolve the Programmme annually. Where the supplementary lesson demand exceeds the core lesson in the following year the supplementary lesson becomes the core lesson.

This year as agreed in the national steering group previously, Crucial Crew will no longer appear on the matrix.

No other changes have been made as no supplementary lesson delivery total exceeded the core lesson delivery total.













2b) The academic year 2104 - 15

The new matrix for 2014-15 has the following additions:

Key Stage 4

- A new substance misuse lesson about Steroids and Image Enhancing drugs (SIEDs). The lesson is entitled Vanity Insanity. It aims to raise awareness of the risks and consequences of using SIEDs. It employs a variety of interactive activities, which will promote pupil discussion around the issues involved. This lesson is supported by teacher follow up work and a pupil information page.
- A new lesson on sexting entitled Risky Pics is being developed on completion of the DVD and will become available for the Spring Term 2015.
- To further strengthen the work around 10,000 Safer Lives and enhance action 7, additional work has been undertaken in this field.

Action 7: Have a joined up and published action plan for educating children and young people on domestic abuse.

Key Stage 3

O A new Domestic Abuse lesson. This lesson is entitled Hidden Hurt. The lesson explores initially what makes a good relationship. Then through the use of a DVD it highlights the relationship between Carys and Rhys so that young people can begin to identify the five types of domestic abuse. Pupils are also encouraged to become aware of what can be done and the agencies that are available for support. This lesson is supported by teacher follow up work and a pupil information page.

Foundation Phase

 A new foundation stage lesson about domestic abuse entitled Safe Haven is currently being developed. This will become available for the Spring Term 2015.

All these lessons can be seen on the 2014-15 matrix see appendix 4

Additional work in relation to assemblies has also been completed and is now available for officers to use. The themes are

- KS3 Shoplifting
- Primary: Domestic Abuse: Talk Pants in partnership with the NSPCC
- o KS3-4 Internet safety: sexting













2c) Accreditation

The aim of accreditation is to create further potential to expand the number of deliveries and work more closely with vulnerable children or those who could potentially become disengaged by adopting a more targeted approach. Consequently the development of accredited KS4 units level 1 and 2 in partnership with Agored Cymru delivered as a 10 lesson block can help achieve this aim. These will be promoted in the secondary schools as a partnership between the AWSLCP and Agored Cymru this term. Furthermore work will be undertaken to create a KS3 level 1 and 2 unit as a precursor to compliment the KS4 units.

PI 2: TO MAINTAIN THE EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS AND EFFECTIVE DELIVERY OF THE AWSLCP

- 75% of officers have successfully qualified on the level 4 Foundation Degree in Learning Support (Education). (PI: 70%)
- All coordinator posts are currently filled.
- All appointed coordinators have an educational background.
- Regular lesson observations have been undertaken this year.

The supportive school policing element shows the strength of the relationship between the schools and the SCPO highlighting the SCPOs whole school involvement which contributes to the ethos of the school. This involvement is beneficial for both education and policing as it highlights working together in partnership to protect vulnerable children and young people. For complete table **see appendix 5**

All aspects of supportive school policing have increased since last year. The number of school beat incidents has risen by 21%, the number of restorative practices has increased by 68% and the number of intelligences by 42%.













To clarify the role of the officers in school a booklet entitled Guidelines for Schools and School Community Police Officers (SCPOs) Working Together: School Behaviour Incident Management has been developed a partnership between Welsh Government, Schools and the Police Forces of Wales. The document provides clear guidance of when School Community Police Officers' (SCPO) services can be utilised by schools to deal with incidents in school which fall under the umbrella of the School Crime Beat Protocol.

PI 3: TO IDENTIFY THE NUMBER OF FIRST TIME ENTRANTS PREVENTED FROM ENTERING THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

PI 4: TO IDENTIFY THE FINANCIAL SAVINGS ASSOCIATED WITH PREVENTING CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE FROM ENTERING THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM

These results are based on the pilot schools only, but due to the information sharing difficulties encountered in using the pupil UPN number 2 forces were unable to record information in its entirety.

Table 1 shows those pupils that did not disrupt or offend again during the period we were able to monitor in the academic year 2013-14. (table 1) The figure differential is due to some cases being ongoing or crimed (table2). These figures are not reflective of the whole academic year as due to information sharing difficulties regarding use of the UPN number it was not possible to record meaningful data in 2 force areas. The majority of the figures are taken from the 'Home Office Research Study 217' paper, The Economic and Social Costs of Crime and the revised paper 30/05. The majority of the low level crime costs are estimates obtained from the various departments within Justice and Partnerships in South Wales Police and are based on very simplistic cases.













4) Abstractions

PI 5: TO MINIMISE THE RATE OF ABSTRACTION OF SCPO'S DURING TERM TIME FROM THEIR CORE SCHOOL ROLE FOR OTHER OPERATIONAL PURPOSES.

The annual rate of abstraction by force and nationally can be seen in the table below:

The figures illustrate (see also **appendix 6**) that this year all forces maintained an abstraction rate below the PI indicator of 5%. The consequent national abstraction rate was 2.41% showing a decrease of 6.49% on the previous academic year.

5) SUMMARY

Pl.1 Welsh Forces to endeavour to access 95% of schools across Wales during the academic year
Nationally the 4 Welsh Police Forces achieved a 99.7% school access rate placing the 4 force access rates in
the RAG system green zone.

P1.2 To maintain the educational standards and effective delivery of the AWSLCP

This has been achieved as:

- 75% of officers are either undertaking or have achieved level accredited training
- All coordinators are in post
- Regular observations by coordinators
- Development of lessons through specialist national working parties

PI.3 To identify the number of first time entrants prevented from entering the criminal justice system

The 4 pilots collectively have illustrated the benefits of early intervention by SCPOs in a school setting by preventing 60 out of 92 pupils from entering the criminal justice system

PI.4 To identify the financial savings associated with preventing children and young people from entering the Criminal Justice System from an AWSLCP perspective

As a consequence of preventing 60 pupils from entering the CJS the financial savings were £78,250

PI.5 To minimise the rate of abstraction of SCPO's during term time from their core school role for other operational purposes.

All forces achieved less than a 5% abstraction rate. Resulting in a national abstraction rate of 2.41










Line graph showing the level of schools accessed 2011-2014










Comparison of lesson deliveries 2011-12 with 2012-13 and 2013-14 by strand.
