1.	RECOMMENDATION					
1.1	It is recommended that the contract for the Provision of Forensic Pathology Services be extended with Cardiff University. The contract is extended in accordance with paragraph 121 of the Manual of Governance.					
1.2	Paragraph 121 is being utilised as the extension of this contract is outside of the original term of the contract and the original approval was approved by OPCC.					
1.3	The three (3) month extension will commence on 1 October 2017 and will expire on 31 December 2017.					
2.	INTRODU	INTRODUCTION & BACKGROUND				
2.1	In September 2012, Gwent Police awarded a contract for the Provision of Forensic Pathology Services which was awarded to Cardiff University, following a single tender process as they are only supplier who can deliver the service in the area. Gwent Police led this contract for the following forces; Dyfed Powys Police, South Wales Police and Gloucestershire Police.					
2.2	The contract was awarded for a period of three (3) years with an option to extend for a further two (2) years, awarded annually. The contract commenced on 1 October 2012.					
2.3	In September 2015 and again in September 2016, the contract was extended utilising the annual extensions available, following a successful three (3) year contract.					
3.	ISSUES FOR CONSIDERATION					
3.1	Cardiff University have provided an excellent provision to all forces mentioned in 2.1, during the last five years.					
3.2	As the lead for this contract, regular communication has been had with the Cardiff University representatives over the past twelve months.					
3.3	As the natural end of the contract approached, we have been working with the University of Cardiff to draft a more efficient service specification for a new					

contract. As the University is the single supplier for the service in Wales, it was deemed vitally important to work with them to ensure the requirements the forces have were achievable through the services they provide and is cognisant of current changes in legislation.		
The work on the specification and new contract document are continuing with the University currently reviewing the specification which is being reviewed by their register pathologists to allow for them to review and comment on it. It is envisage that this should be completed by them in the coming weeks.		
Based on this feedback above from the University and the timescales they have identified, it is recommended that we extend the current contract with them to ensure compliance with the Manual of Governance and for the other forces who utilise the contract.		
The University have confirmed that they are happy to extend the current contract for a three (3) month period.		
NEXT STEPS		
On approval of this report, an extension to contract document will be drafted in accordance with the original contract and issued to Cardiff University for signature.		
FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS		
For the three (3) month extension period, Gwent's guaranteed spend will be £5,330 which is a pro-rata figure of the annual retainer paid by each force, to the University, to secure the provision.		
Further to the annual retainer, Gwent is then required to pay a case fee of £2,855.56 for each case which utilises the Forensic Pathology provision as per the contract.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS		
There are no legal implications applicable to this contract extension.
